### Finance Committee Seeking Members

The Tamarack Trails Finance Committee is seeking two new committee members. The term will begin in January 2021. Terms are for two years with the option of continuing on the committee for a total of 6 years. This committee meets once a month with the exception of December when there is no meeting. Typically, the committee meets at 4:00 on the third Wednesday of the month. Meetings usually last 1.5 hours. It is helpful if committee members have experience working with budgets and financial reports, but there is no requirement for committee membership other than being an Association owner. The committee is responsible for monitoring Tamarack's finances, including the Association's Investment Fund, making recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding financial matters, identifying financial issues and participating in the development of the annual budget. The Association is currently on solid financial footing so the workload for new committee members should not be taxing. ## Seasonal Reminders & Projects

### Miniature White Lights Guidelines ...

For safety and security purposes, homeowners may install miniature, non-twinkling, white lights between October 25th to March 15<sup>th</sup>. (After that date, the lights must be removed, not simply turned off.) The lights may adorn trees, shrubs, fences and light posts on the owner's property (lot). If requested by TT staff, the owner is responsible for removing the lights from a tree or shrub to facilitate winter pruning. Tamarack Trails may also install miniature, non-twinkling white lights on common areas for safety and security.

... and Holiday Decoration Guidelines

In addition to white lights you may install and enjoy seasonal decorations observing the following guidelines:

- All outside seasonal decorations must be confined to the homeowner's home or within 4 feet of the building, sidewalk, patio, decorative fence or post light.
- All exterior decorations must be removed within two weeks of the calendar holiday.
- Strings of lights or garlands are discouraged from being attached to the building, particularly if nails are used. Lights or decorations on a tree on Association common property are discouraged. If such decorations are used, the tree must be no more than fifteen (15) feet from the homeowner's lot line.
- Please note that all neighbors must give permission to decorate a tree in the vicinity of their home.

In both cases:

All extension cords must be marked and protected so that letter carriers, snow shovelers and others will be able to see the cord and avoid an accident. Homeowners must assume the responsibility for any accidents involving such extension cords.

## **Board and Committee Business**

#### **Architectural Review Committee**

The ARB is charged with monitoring the integrity of the external design and visual appearance of structures within TT and to monitor the appearance of community properties.

Members of the ARB, in accordance with TT Restated Declaration Article VI, conduct an annual walkthrough of TT Phases to observe compliance of TT residents with the ARB Standards. **This year the walk through will take place between October 26 and November 8**. Members conducting the walkthrough will be in pairs, wearing a vest designating them as volunteers, wearing a mask, and more than likely carrying a clipboard.

The walk through and ARB Standards are not intended to infringe on any resident's ability to enjoy the use of their property, but rather to ensure that TT continues to be an attractive community and that it's architectural unity is maintained

## **Tamarack News and Tidbits**

## Tamarack Trails is a planned unit development (PUD). What is that?

A planned unit development combines the advantages of condominium living with private home ownership. When you buy a home in a PUD community, you are deeded a lot along with your residence. In addition, you are granted the right to enjoy and use the common areas and recreation facilities.

#### **How is Tamarack Trails governed?**

Every unit owner is a member of the Tamarack Trails Community Services Association, Inc. The community is governed by a seven-person Board of Directors elected by Tamarack's 320 owners. The Board hires an Association Manager who, in turn, hires a Maintenance Superintendent, Landscape Superintendent, and Administrative Assistant to assist in running the operation. Additional permanent and temporary staff are also employed.

Tamarack has ongoing contracts with outside professional firms for landscape maintenance, snow removal, and trash/recycling management. In addition, contractors are hired for special projects such as major residence structural work, roof repairs, stormwater remediation, asphalt and cement work, etc.

**Where:** Walk or run your own course any time from Nov. 20-29th. You may complete the trot/walk in one day or over several days.


