

Seasonal Reminders & Projects

Group Air Conditioner Checkup

The staff at the Tamarack office has arranged for and will coordinate a group air conditioner cleaning and inspection for Tamarack residents. *R.A. Heating* will perform a 15-point annual inspection and cleaning of the cooling system for a discounted rate. The rate depends on the number of homeowners that sign up. A minimum of 10 residents must sign up for this offering to move forward. The normal rate for this service is \$125 and the group rate will vary with the number of participants (starting at 101 + tax per inspection with 8 residents and decreasing to \$96 + tax per inspection if more than 10 sign up. The price includes - cleaning the air conditioner unit, a "Summer Cooling 15 Point Inspection", and the installation of a new standard 1" filter. The price does not include – Space guard, Air Bear, or any highly efficient filters. Highly efficient filters (if needed) will be billed out at \$42.20 a piece at the time of the inspection.

Spring News from the Maintenance Committee

Spring has sprung and our busiest season begins. While the spring yard cleanup had a few hiccups, the mulch has already been blown in and looks great.

Concrete, timber/rock wall, deck, and asphalt projects are scheduled and ready to go. The Pine Ridge asphalt replacement is planned for mid-June. Affected residents will be kept informed every step of the way.

Painting has begun on Gray Birch and Hemlock. Our maintenance staff will continue their work on chimney caps, trim replacement, and deck repair. If you notice rotted wood, put in a work order.

Staff will be doing power washing, landscape work, painting, and other projects will be grouped together and completed by. It is more efficient for them to work this way rather than skipping around the property. You do not need to put in a work order for this work. Of course, any safety issues or emergencies will be dealt with first.

Here are some things owners should do to improve safety and comfort.

Dryer vents – In the past, Tamarack staff has done complete dryer vent cleaning. Staff can no longer do this. They will check the exterior where the vent leaves the house, but owners are responsible for having the interior portion cleaned. This should be done at least every other year. If enough people are interested perhaps, we can organize a group buy.

Attic/ceiling insulation – Insulation is an owner's responsibility. Adequate insulation, professionally installed and vented is the greatest deterrent to ice dams and interior water damage. Please have yours assessed (there is a contractor many owners have used). Once completed, Tamarack staff has been installing trim vents where appropriate.

Chimney dampers/sweeping – Owners should have their chimneys inspected and cleaned by a professional each season to lessen the chance of fires, animals taking residence, and catching any deterioration of the flue. Tamarack staff and contractors have been replacing the chimney caps and screens. They report some dampers are rusted and in need of replacement. It makes sense that this be done while they are working on the chimney - and cheaper - than having a contractor come back to do it later. Staff will discuss this with you when your chimney cap is being replaced.

We have a busy summer ahead and it is the Maintenance Committee's intention to keep everyone as up to date as possible. Please feel free to contact us with any questions you may have.

Tamarack News and Tidbits

If I would like to do any landscaping around my home, do I need approval?

Yes, for some flower garden, shrubs and trees. Although each unit includes the surrounding lot, the Association maintains the lot. The Association Manager and/or the Maintenance Committee must approve any landscaping changes. The Association is responsible for the maintenance, trimming, and replacement of trees and shrubs. Additional plantings are done at the homeowner's expense once approved. Flowerbeds (annuals and perennials) within an owner's lot are not installed or maintained by the Association. The Association does not water during the summer, although residents are encouraged to water trees and shrubs around their unit. Please refer to Policy Resolution V-500, Landscaping Policy.
