# Just One Day of Your Life Can Change Someone Else's Forever





Home fires claim seven lives every day, but having working smoke alarms can cut the risk of death by half. That's why the American Red Cross is rallying volunteers to install free smoke alarms in Madison, as part of the Sound the Alarm event.

On Saturday, April 15, 2023, volunteers will install free smoke alarms, create escape plans and share fire safety information. Training will be provided.

### **Group Air Conditioner Checkup**

The staff at the Tamarack office has arranged for and will coordinate a group air conditioner cleaning and inspection for Tamarack residents. *R.A. Heating* will perform a 15-point annual inspection and cleaning of the cooling system for a discounted rate. The rate depends on the number of homeowners that sign up. A minimum of 10 residents must sign up for this offering to move forward. The normal rate for this service is \$125 and the group rate will vary with the number of participants (starting at 101 + tax per inspection with 8 residents and decreasing to \$96 + tax per inspection if more than 10 sign up. The price includes - cleaning the air conditioner unit, a "Summer Cooling 15 Point Inspection", and the installation of a new standard 1" filter. The price does not include – Space guard, AprilAire, EZ flex or any highly efficient filters. Highly efficient filters (if needed) will be billed out at \$60.00 + tax at the time of the inspection.

Deadline for signing up for this service is April 24th.

#### **West Area: Open House Details**

The West Area Plan team has coordinated with other City departments and divisions on scheduling a West Area open house for Wednesday, May 10, from 6:30-8:00 p.m. at Lussier Community Education Center, 55 S. Gammon Road. It will feature the following divisions and topics:

- Metro Transit: Network Redesign and Bus Rapid Transit
- Engineering: <u>street and path construction projects</u>, <u>watershed studies</u>, <u>and greenway projects</u>
- Transportation: <u>Vision Zero</u>, <u>Safe Streets Madison</u>
- Parks: park development plans
- Water Utility: Well 14 chloride mitigation
- Community Development: <u>affordable housing</u>
- Planning: West Area Plan

Additionally, West Area Plan background/existing condition maps have been posted to the project web page.

### **Board and Committee Business**

#### Board Notes for 3/28/23 meeting

The Board of Directors met in-person and by Zoom on March 28. 6 Directors and Association Manager Stacey Haberman were present, as were 21 residents. Director Jacobs was excused. Treasurer Larry White presented Tamarack's financial report and President Dean Ryerson addressed several topics. The major discussion topic was the new Book of Standards (BoS) created by the Architectural Review Board (ARB).

Several residents brought forward issues:

- Janet Hirsch and George Meyer had concerns about the current legal status of the Board to enforce provisions of the BoS. This was discussed later in the meeting.
- Les Mirkin expressed concern over inequities in fees for participating in events: If nonresidents are part of an event at the Clubhouse (e.g., yoga), then all participants must
  pay \$1. Les proposed eliminating these fees entirely. Stacey Haberman noted that the
  annual revenue from these fees approaches \$900 and is a line item in the budget. The
  Board declined to change the practice and Les agreed given the total amount of fees
  collected.
- Elizabeth Goulette spoke to water damage in her unit. She had commissioned a survey
  which found that the damage was caused by improperly installed trim and siding. She
  requests a review by Tamarack to establish responsibility for the damage. Manager
  Haberman will follow-up on this concern.

Stacey Haberman reported on several issues including staffing and maintenance. Major points:

- 7 lifeguards are committed to work during the upcoming pool season.
- After interviewing 9 candidates, there are 2 strong possibilities for Maintenance Supervisor.
- 3 students are returning to assist with grounds/maintenance this summer.
- There were 13 work order requests in February: 12 maintenance and 1 grounds.

- There have been several calls regarding rotten interior and exterior wood. Preventive maintenance is our priority.
- We have 4 quotes for exterior painting on 50-80 Oak Creek Trail, ranging from \$49,500 -\$123,000.

Treasurer White reported that Tamarack finances are in good shape. The finance committee is analyzing projections for different inflation rates to ensure Tamarack future reserves are strong.

The ARB submitted the revised BoS to the Board for approval. As noted above, issues surfaced related to language in our governing documents. These issues require additional consideration. There was animated discussion about the process, content, and form of the BoS, which resulted in the Board deferring further action until the April meeting.

Dean Ryerson noted that April is Volunteer Recognition month and requested Board approval to hold a "thank you" event at the Clubhouse for current volunteer residents. The date set is Wednesday, April 19 from 5:30-7 pm.

In other action, Jayne Meyer has drafted a letter to be sent from Board President Ryerson to the city attorney regarding zoning changes and has created a list of legal issues for the Board to investigate. Paul Skidmore asked if Tamarack has an attorney of record; we do and will clarify that relationship. The Board approved this year's No Mow May proposal, a lawn reseeding proposal, and the 2023 Recreation Policy.



# Neighbors for a Greener Tamarack Spring Forward!

**OUT OF HIBERNATION** – Just like many critters over wintering, NGT members are out of hibernation, busy and moving forward on our plans for 2023.

**NO MOW MAY**—Our 2023 No Mow May proposal was presented to both the Maintenance Committee and the Board in March and was accepted; we now move forward on much needed logistics. The 8 sites are well distributed throughout the Tamarack campus:

Site #1: 38-54 Oak Creek bordering the Sauk Creek Greenway

Site #2: 7404-7414 Cedar Creek bordering the Sauk Creek Greenway and the main swale

Site #3: 90-92 **Oak Creek** facing the main swale and Club House parking lot

Site #4: 29 Mt Ash bordering Tree Lane and Mt Ash (Low Mow May test site)

Site #5: 15-23 Mt Ash cul de sac plus 11 Winterberry.

Site #6: 26 Bayberry plus 2, 4, and 22 Pin Oak bordering the north side of Tree Lane

Site #7: 85-97 Oak Creek cul de sac plus 11 Oak Creek

Site #8: 1-19 Hemlock cul de sac bordering Westfield

Sites 1, 2, 3 and 4 are in their second year; the other sites are new this year. Thanks to all residents who have volunteered to participate at the 8 sites chosen for this season.

Low Mow May test site. As part of this year's No Mow May event, NGT has designated one of the eight sites – site #4 listed above - as a test of the City of Madison's/Dane County's "Low Mow May" strategy. Unlike the other 7 sites which will not get mowed in

May, the LMM site will be mowed once in the middle of the month. More information about Low Mow May will be available at the Clubhouse beginning in early May.

We look forward to many residents touring sites and providing feedback. Watch for our colorful signs; pick up a map and a questionnaire at the Office and spend an afternoon visiting sites, seeing changes and maybe some sprouting flora providing much-needed food to the overwintered pollinators! *Don't forget to complete your questionnaire and drop off at the Office.*

If you would prefer that the area around your residence not receive these treatments, you can sign up for the "No Spray List" by contacting Angie Swan, our Grounds Superintendent at 833-5445. Join more than 80 of your Tamarack neighbors who are currently on the list.

**INDEPENDENT WEEDING OF TAMARACK SITES—** If you miss joining us on Earth Day, there are also a number of Independent Weeding Sites designated by Angie Swan, Grounds Superintendent, where you and a friend or two can weed at a time that works best for you.
