#### **Seeking Candidates to Fill Vacant Board of Directors Seats**

The Nominations and Elections Committee of Tamarack is seeking three candidates to fill upcoming vacant seats on our Board of Directors. Directors may serve two 2-year terms. The final list of candidates will be distributed on or before October 5 in preparation for the election at the October 26 Annual Meeting of the Association. Any residents interested in self-nominating for a seat must submit a petition to our office stating their intent and signed by six members of the Association on or before September 14. Other candidates will be nominated by the Nominations and Elections Committee.

# Seasonal Reminders & Projects

#### Cars, Cars & More Cars

We've been getting more comments about cars and vehicle parking on our property. Yup, we've got rules about that: *Policy Resolution I-102 Vehicles and Other Large Equipment Kept in Community* 

**Summary:** Vehicles should be parked in your garage. The number of vehicles allowed is determined by the spaces that can be accommodated by the garage and driveway space directly adjacent to the garage.

Owners with a one car garage are permitted to park no more than two vehicles on the property and only one may park outside of the garage at any time. Owners with a two-car garage are permitted to park no more than four vehicles on the property and only two may park outside of the garage at any time.

Restricted vehicles should be parked in the garage. They are not allowed on the trails, driveways, or guest parking spaces. Included on the list of restricted vehicles are commercial vehicles, RVs, trailers, boats and campers.

Any vehicle parked on our property should be on the asphalt, not the grass. This includes the vehicles of guests and service providers.

#### **Board and Committee Business**

#### Board Notes for 7/20/23 special meeting & 7/25/23 regular meeting

<u>A special meeting of the Board of Directors</u> was held in person and by Zoom on July 20, 2023. 6 Directors and Association Manager Stacey Haberman were present, as were 6 residents. Director Skidmore was excused. There were two business items.

First, then Board approved including the revised Book of Standards (BoS) into Policy IV-400. This policy gives the Association Manager, the Architectural Review Board, and the Board of Directors the authority to implement and enforce the provisions of the BoS.

Second, there was a discussion to identify barriers to residents volunteering to be involved in Tamarack governance, and possible solutions. Among the issues considered: people are too busy, a lack of clear understanding of committee and Board roles, a reluctance to deal with conflict, a sense that their views weren't really considered, and a preference to simply live at Tamarack without further engagement. It was also noted that this is a broader issue across organizations. More details will be reported in the future.

The group also saw the 50th Anniversary as an opportunity for more people to become involved.

<u>A regular meeting of the Board of Directors</u> was held in person and by Zoom on July 25, 2023. All Directors and Association Manager Stacey Haberman were present, as were 20 residents.

The major discussion topics were the upcoming Board of Director election, how city ordinances and Tamarack covenants relate, and the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration.

Residents expressed concern about rabbits and gypsy moths. There's little the association can do about these issues, but there will be information forthcoming about moths.

Association Manager Stacey Haberman reported on several items including staffing and maintenance.

Major points:

- Rollie Remhoff is completing CPO (Certified Pool Operator) training and is also taking courses to be able to pull permits on our own. New part-time maintenance employee (Julio Galvez) started July 24th. We are running ads for our Maintenance Technician openings.
- Scheduling lifeguards for August and September is problematic as students return to school. We are looking to add additional lifeguards. (Note that this is a local and national problem.)
- Beginning July 31,2023, Appfolio will no longer be waiving the resident eCheck transaction fee. Resident payments made by eCheck will include a fee of \$2.49 per month. There are two ways to avoid this fee added by Appfolio: bring payments directly to the Tamarack office or contact your bank and set up an automatic bill pay with them.
- Poblocki Paving & Affordable Concrete should start concrete work the week of 7/31 for concrete work. Asphalt will begin after concrete is complete.
- Greenscapes liquid fertilizer/herbicide is now August 3 and 4 depending on weather.

Treasurer White reported that Tamarack finances are in good shape but noted that we expect a \$4,000-\$5,000 increase in insurance premiums next year due to rising property values.

In other business, the Board approved a contract to address wood rot on Mountain Ash Trail. President Ryerson reported that the Nominations and Elections Committee has been formed: Joan Foster, George Meyer, Leslie Mirkin, John Oaks, Sue Rapa, Eve Siegel. All residents are encouraged to consider running for the Board. Ryerson also noted that attracting and retaining a good staff is essential, and the HR Committee will do a deep dive into how improve staff retention. The Board approved a resident survey about the Tamarack web site. Larry White reported that the Amenities Committee would bring a proposal for additional benches on the trails. Bob Jacobs and Larry White reported on proposed changes to several by-laws. Mostly minor adjustments in wording, these were accepted by the Board. Jayne Meyer led a discussion about how city ordinances and Tamarack covenants relate. This is an evolving process that requires ongoing Board attention. Finally, there was discussion about Tamarack's 50th Anniversary Celebration in 2024. A committee is being formed to develop plans, opportunities, and information for all residents.

The 2024 Budget Hearing will be October 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm, in person and on Zoom. The 2023 Annual Meeting will be October 26<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm at Vista West, in person and on Zoom.

The next monthly Board Meeting is August 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6:30 pm, in person and on Zoom.

The Spread of the Spongy Moth Here and Nearby-- The existence of these moths (previously called gypsy moths) have been found in Tamarack on a handful of trees. The trees are being treated to reduce the spread and the life cycle of the egg masses. It's too late this season to see any caterpillars, but moths and egg masses may be visible. Angie Swan, Landscape Superintendent, would like you to contact her should you find any evidence on any trees here.

Currently, there is no need to begin a volunteer effort like the City has begun. We all value the lovely mature trees here and we will keep a close watch on this new invasive early next spring.

These photos show the moth with the egg masses and the caterpillar stage. There are eradication methods that can be taken early to reduce the spread and destruction.
