October Fall Cleanup Neighbors for a Greener Tamarack

Tamarack residents have suggested a fall cleanup day as a follow up to the cleanup we did in early June. It will be scheduled for early to mid-October. Again, Neighbors for a Greener Tamarack will sponsor the event.

The group has identified two priority sites. If we get a sufficient number of volunteers we will add a third site. One site will be the small, wooded area off the walking trail between Sugar Maple Trail and Red Maple Trail. A second site chosen is the rock gardens near the Tamarack entrance sign on Tree Lane facing Vista West. Depending on the number of volunteers, a third site will be the Red Maple shady drainage area just off Westfield.

Board and Committee Business

The Board Notes

The Board of Directors met by Zoom on August 23. All directors were present and thirty-one residents joined the Zoom meeting. The Treasurer reviewed Tamarack's financial reports and board liaisons reviewed minutes of committee meetings. Major discussion topics were the search for a new Association Manager, the pool, Tamarack's insurance policy and approval of two Fall maintenance projects.

Seven residents interviewed two candidates forwarded by the resident screening committee. Although both candidates had good credentials, the interview group did not think that either candidate met our current needs for an Association Manager. The board will broaden the recruitment search and report on progress at the September meeting. That search could involve the engagement of a search firm.

The Board discussed issues Tamarack has had with lifeguards this pool season and reviewed two recent incidents at the pool. The two pool incidents both involved clubhouse rental and will be followed up on. One guard's employment has been terminated. As remaining guards return to school in the Fall, the Board will work to achieve full coverage during the remainder of this challenging pool season.

The proposed 2023 premium from our existing insurer was a substantial increase. The Finance Committee formed an ad hoc committee to investigate insurance market options. One of the members, Dave Larson, a former insurance professional, obtained and presented a proposal from Rural Mutual. Rural Mutual deals exclusively with Wisconsin properties and was able to offer better coverage at considerably less cost. The Board approved the Rural Mutual proposal and that annual coverage will begin September 1, 2022.

Due largely to salary savings in 2022, the Finance Committee anticipates an operating budget surplus this year. The Board approved transferring a portion of the expected surplus to two important maintenance projects this Fall. The first is contracting out required pruning made necessary because of landscape maintenance crew shortages this year. The second is masonry repair of the clubhouse chimneys to address leakage.

Other discussion topics included a water main break at Pin Oak Trail, the results of the 2022 No-Mow May project and DJ Frank's redesign of the lower end of the swale.

The next board meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 27.

Forward Through Fall—ARB

Book of Standards Update: The Architectural Review Board, ARB, as you know has a very busy Book of Standards Workgroup. If you're a new resident, a copy of the current edition is available on Tamarack website: https://www.tamaracktrails.com/wp-content/uploads/2019/05/ARB-BoS-2017-04-05.pdf

Plans are to hold the required public hearing on the proposed changes yet this fall. (Date/time to be determined.) Your input will be considered in developing the final draft, which will be forwarded to the Tamarack Board of Directors for comment and approval.

Annual Fall Walk-Through: Another scheduled fall event for the ARB is the Annual Walk-Through. ARB Members team up and walk around the Tamarack campus looking for non-conformance to the BOS. You'll recognize them wearing yellow safety vests and walking around most sides of your unit. Any health and safety issues found will be communicated to appropriate staff. Residents found in noncompliance will be notified of such for correction or removal. An email will be sent prior to the week of the Annual Walk-Through.

Resident Requests: If you are planning an exterior addition or modification yet this fall, note that requests must be received no later than 14 days prior to regularly scheduled meeting. The ARB meets the second Weds. of each month, except December (Sept. 14, Oct. 12, and Nov. 9).

Starting September 13th Tamarack Featured Artist is Don Haasl.



Don uses a scroll saw to make craft art using local woods as well as rarer woods from around the world. His creations include mostly holiday ornaments, wall plagues, clocks and puzzles with a few items like bowls, birdhouses and nativity scenes thrown in. Family members, friends and various fundraising church bazaars have been the fortunate recipients of Don's craft art. It requires patience, steady hands and keen eyes to make these creations which can often take more than 20 hours to complete.
