ARB News & Updates

GRILLS AND FIRE PITS

It is that time of year when we spend a bit more time outside enjoying our yards, patios and decks. Please refer to the BOOK of STANDARDS, IV 12- GRILLS, OUTDOOR HEATING UNITS, FIRE RINGS, and OTHER OPEN FLAMES FIRE PITS. These items are listed in this document and mainly refer to the City of Madison ordinances, which supersedes any HOA covenants or standards. Be aware of grill placement-- wood decks, distances to combustible materials and ability to add up to 15 sq. ft. of concrete pavers or bricks under grills within your unit lot. Tamarack Trails does not allow open or uncontained fires anywhere on the grounds of Tamarack Trails.

DRYER VENTS

Another precaution that may trigger a fire is to have a plan to clean out dryer vents. The ARB sees a number of these that from the outside appear to need a cleanout. Check with the Office if a group service is being planned much like the AC checkups.

ANNUAL ARB WALK AROUND

The ARB is embarking on their annual Walk Around planned to begin the last half of May, weather and schedules permitting. If you contacted us about joining the Walk Around, we'll contact you after the May ARB meeting.

We will record primarily safety issues as well as non-complying items. Watch for an email alert from the Office regarding what weeks you may see us Out & About!

NGT is gearing up for Low Mow May and will soon place flags and signage in the participating areas for 2025. The Low Mow May sites will have once a month mowing. A number of sites from

years past continue to be in the project and expansion sites now include the perimeter of the Community Gardens and areas adjacent to walking trails east of Westfield. Reducing mowing not only encourages flowering of various plants for early feeding of pollinators but also gives some turf areas a chance to restore from the normal weekly mowing and soil compaction issues.
