Pool Progress

The pool renovation is moving forward. We all watched the pool basin as it was renovated last fall. Now, we're watching the final details unfold.

The first concrete pour of the pool deck was on Tuesday, May 27th. The second section was completed at the end of the week. The third concrete section will complete the deck. Morel concrete work will occur with additional curb and concrete near the tennis courts, at the entry sidewalk to the pool and at the driveway and air conditioner pads on the east side of the clubhouse. Electrical work is as far as they can go until the concrete work is completed.

Once the pool deck is done, Struck & Irwin will be able to remove the temporary fence and install the new one.

Badger Swimpools, Inc., our pool contractor, has been on-site to complete a couple of minor repairs. Their next step is to start plastering the inside of the pool basin. Once that is done, it needs to sit for six to seven days before we can start adding water.

Two of our veteran lifeguards are ready to jump in. While they are waiting, they can be seen around the property while they help with maintenance and grounds projects.

The weather-related goal is to have the pool open in the middle of June.

Make sure that you are prepared. It's time to dig out your summer pool gear and be ready for opening day. Find your pool access card. *Don't have a card? Check with the office to purchase one.*

Board and Committee Business

Board Meeting Notes - May 27, 2025

This is an informal report about the regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors. Official minutes will be posted on the Tamarack website after approval by the Board.

The board approved a change order from Decorative Concrete Construction for additional concrete work on the pool deck and a contract with Strang to conduct a structural evaluation of the clubhouse. A proposal to add one week to the end of the pool season was sent to the Amenities Committee for a recommendation.

A motion was approved to direct the Budget Committee to look into the feasibility of including in the 2026 or subsequent years budget the installation of a two-row solar panel system on the clubhouse. As with ALL capital projects, it will be evaluated to determine it's place on the priority list and the availability of funding for this year and beyond.

Our finances are audited every year. At their June meeting, the Finance Committee has scheduled a presentation of our 2024 financial audit by Wegner CPAs.

ANNUAL ARB WALK AROUND



At their May 14th meeting, the ARB confirmed the details for their annual Walk Around; we plan to begin the last half of May, weather and schedules permitting, and provide updates at our June 11th meeting. We will be walking about all phases of Tamarack in teams of two; we will be wearing yellow or orange vests, carrying clipboards and taking pictures of items which may need immediate attention or do not conform to the Book of Standards (BOS). AGING IN PLACE WHILE LIVING THE GOOD LIFE AT TAMARACK

Getting around safely inside and outside your unit is an issue a number of us think about on a daily basis. Our units have aged and so have some of us; many building changes have occurred since the 70's pertaining to health and safety issues. One apparent issue as we enter our units or move about on various levels of our homes is steps and stairs and if they have handrails.

Graspable handrails are ones where the shape allows you to get a firm hand hold – gripping it with both your hand and your thumb. See BOS IV. 7 for details and pictures of acceptable entry steps and handrails. A completed Form 2 is required for such an exterior modification.

ARB APPROVALS EXPIRE 1-YEAR AFTER APPROVAL

- Have you been granted approval for your ARB request in the past year or two and have
 yet to begin the project? <u>As per the BOS, the approval expires one year from the
 approval date.</u> If this applies to you, you will need to submit a Form 2 to request an
 extension of the approval; see deadline dates below.
- Have you been granted approval for your ARB request in the past year and your project has been completed? Owners are required to contact ARB, chair or contact person, once the approved project has been completed. Sometimes our ARB contact person may have missed the completion of your project; if we didn't visit your site, please contact us.

NMM/LMM - Updates on Low Mow and No Mow May

No Mow and Low Mow May has ended for the season. We hope you walked about and saw the blue flags and signage in the participating areas for 2025. A number of sites from past years have continued to be in the project. This year expanded sites included the perimeter of the Community Gardens and areas adjacent to the walking trails east of Westfield Road. If you have an area on your trail that you think would be ideal for a future NMM/LMM site, contact a member of NGT—Paulette Harder or Scott Butler.

Reducing mowing not only encourages flowering of various plants for early feeding of pollinators but also gives some turf areas a chance to restore from the normal weekly mowing and soil compaction issues. And in addition, some residents will only hear the mowers every two weeks.

All of the proposed sites would be a continuation of the mission of NGT in educating residents on planting more native plants and their benefits.
